Sunday 31st October 2021 is the closing date for applications to all Secondary Schools for our current Year 6. This is an online application which parents and carers will find on the Calderdale Council website on the schools ADMISSIONS page.

Parents who would like their child to attend Trinity Academy, Halifax and/or Trinity Academy Sowerby Bridge (now called Trinity Academy Grammar but NOT a grammar school) will need to register their child to sit the Fair Banding Assessment for their child to have a chance of attending the Trinity schools.

At Ash Green, children will be able to sit the Fair Banding Assessment at our school on 5th October with their own classmates in class here at Ash Green. This assessment covers both Trinity schools' applications.

COVID 19 SYMPTOMS, TESTS, FOLLOW UP!

Remember that if anyone in your family is showing symptoms of Covid 19:

- A high temperature for any period of time
- A new and continuous cough
- A loss of smell or taste

That person will need a Covid 19 PCR test. For this, follow: https://www.nhs.uk/conditions/coronavirus-covid-19/

Now that we have returned, Calderdale guidance will be:

If a child or staff member shows these symptoms they should NOT come into school/will be sent home from school. A test should be arranged. When the test is negative they can return.

IF a test is positive that person would need to isolate for 10 days and we would contact the families of anyone we felt may have been a contact.

There is no longer a requirement for children under 18 or double jabbed adults to isolate as contacts. However, the recommendation is that those contacts- including household members of the positive case- take a PCR test, they do not have to isolate unless that test proved positive.

It remains such a difficult time for us all. Covid cases are still worryingly high and we must put continued measures in place to support distancing, increased hygiene and prevent widespread contact between groups. The safety and welfare of our children, families and staff members is paramount.
